Lady Justice

Lady Justice is one of the most famous landmarks in London. It is a bronze statue that stands on the domed roof of the Old Bailey. This building houses the central criminal courts where people who are accused of breaking

the law are tried by a judge and jury to find out if they are 'guilty' and should be punished or 'not guilty' and can go free.

Lady Justice was designed to be a symbol of justice: in her left hand she carries the scales of truth and fairness and in her right hand a double edged sword representing the power of reason and justice.



New laws are passed every year by the government. Ask each member of the family to think of a law which they think the government should pass. Talk about your ideas and how your new law would make a difference.



FASCINATING FACTS

The World Village

If the world was a village, with 100 people living in it:

- 61 people would come from Asia,
 13 from Africa, 13 from the Americas,
 12 from Europe and 1 from Australasia
- 27 of the people would be under 15 and just 7 of them over 64
- half of the people would speak one of just 8
 languages and the most common language would be Chinese
- · 63 village people would not have running water in their homes
- · 18 people would not be able to read or write
- 53 villagers would have less than £1.30 a day to live on
- · there would be 18 cars in the village

KINGFISHER CLASS



In Science, Kingfisher class have been investigating bubbles.

We added bicarbonate of soda to our hot toffee to make honeycomb, it puffed up with bubbles. We then drew clear diagrams in our science books to compare them. We tried some to see if they tasted different.

We continued our learning by looking at what temperature of water produced the best bubbles. We looked at yeast and bicarbonate of soda. Yeast and warm water was the best. Though bicarbonate of soda with hot water created a vacuum and sucked the balloon inside the bottle.





We also created our own bubbles! We looked at how yeast and bicarbonate of soda are used to make bread. We tried a variety of breads and even one that contained no bubbles!









We enjoyed eating some delicious ice creams so that we could practise everything we have learned in our French lessons this term. Miss de Carles was very impressed with how polite and accurate all children were when asking for their ice cream.
