HOT LUNCHES ORDER CHANGES IMPORTANT PLEASE READ

In order for our school lunch system to run as efficiently as possible and to increase the amount of teaching time within the classroom we will be changing the way that children order lunches from Thursday January 10th when lunches resume from Rendcomb College.

Before we break up each half term, we will be sending a paper copy of our lunch menu home to all parents. On the menu we will be asking you to pre book your hot meals for the three weeks period our menu is set. The choices you make will then last for the duration of a half term and then parents will be able to re order so that children get the option to try something different on the menu for the following half term.

For this system to work it will require menu choices to come back to the school as soon as possible so we are able to get administration processes in place before the start of every new half term.

Should your child be absent we will take your child from the lunch list so that there will be no charge for that day. If your child has pre-selected a lunch but wishes to bring a packed lunch on the day please notify the office on the morning.
