 - the progress made by these pupils
 - o the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers"

 is being made.
- Targeted teacher intervention.

- Curriculum enrichment
 We believe that every child should be able to take advantage of our extra curricula
 activities and the visits and trips that we organise. The impact of these children's
 learning is significant and these play a vital role in enthusing and motivating children's

learning. Pupil Premium funding can be used to ensure all pupils are able to take part in enrichment activities. Additionally, we plan to provide children with free access to after school sports clubs.

- Learning programmes and curriculum resources to enhance the learning of our Pupil Premium children. Some of the programmes projected to be funded are accelerated reader, the mighty writer, star maths, nessy reading and jungle memory.
- Sen Specialist services within the Pupil Premium cohort.
- Free School milk for all Pupil Premium children.
