- "Ofsted inspections report on how schools' use of the funding affects the attainment of their disadvantaged pupils. We also hold schools to account through performance tables, which include data on:
 - o the attainment of the pupils who attract the funding
 - the progress made by these pupils
 - o the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers"

Our School Vision

FUNDING ALLOCATION

At North Cerney C of E Primary Academy we strive to ensure that all children have the opportunity to achieve their full potential. We want to prepare them for modern Britain and equip them with the knowledge, skills and understanding for the world after primary school. The effective use of Pupil Premium funding supports us to be able to achieve these aims.

Funding 2017-2018 was allocated to:

- Targeted intervention groups. TA support is provided for identified children in
 identified areas by providing focused teaching for small groups of children throughout
 the school. We work towards ensuring that all children make good progress in English
 and Maths. Our focus is to enable the children to reach at least national expectations
 for their year group. We monitor their progress across the terms to ensure that impact
 is being made.
- Targeted support from external agencies for pupils whose needs might include the support of counselling services.
- Training and CPD to enable us to support all children and to close the gaps where they exist between groups and individuals.
- Curriculum enrichment
 - We believe that every child should be able to take advantage of our extra curricula activities and the visits and trips that we organise. The impact of these children's learning is significant and these play a vital role in enthusing and motivating children's learning. Pupil Premium funding can be used to ensure all pupils are able to take part in enrichment activities. In 2018 to 2019 we assisted Pupil premium children in participating in two residential visits.
- Learning programmes and curriculum resources to enhance the learning of our Pupil Premium children. Some of the programmes used this academic year include Accelerated Reader, Mighty Writer, Star Maths, Nessy Reading and Spelling, and Jungle Memory.
- Resources to promote attendance within our Pupil Premium cohort and throughout the school. We believe that attendance is vital to all children and strongly encourage children to attend school daily to ensure the highest level of learning possible. We have introduced a class weekly attendance reward which is promoted to our parents via newsletter, signage across the school to promote attendance, termly 100% attendance rewards and a termly most improved attendance reward.
- SEN specialist services within the Pupil Premium cohort.
