



<b>inventor</b>	.A person who invents. Who has new ideas and makes something new which is helpful to others		<input type="checkbox"/> The first motorised and controlled flight was in 1903 by two brothers, Orville and Wilbert Wright
<b>aviation</b>	Flying using an aircraft		<input type="checkbox"/> The first mass produced car was the Model T Ford in 1908 by Henry Ford in the United States of America
<b>cockpit</b>	The area of the plane where the pilot sits. Inside the cockpit are all the controls for the aircraft		<input type="checkbox"/> In 1930 Amy Johnson became the first woman to fly solo from the UK to Australia
<b>fuselage</b>	The body of the aircraft		<input type="checkbox"/> In 1969, Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins were the first men to reach the Moon and Neil Armstrong was the first man to walk on the Moon
<b>locomotive</b>	An engine that moves by its own power		
<b>Rainhill Trials</b>	A competition which was held to decide which mode of transport should be used on the Liverpool and Manchester Railway		
<b>eyewitness account</b>	An account of what happened from someone who was there at the time		
<b>evidence</b>	Photographs, objects, newspaper entries, diaries, telling us about what it was like in the past
