# SCHOOL CLEAN UP


The teachers and TAs who have been in school have seized the opportunity to give the place a declutter and spring clean, so that it is at its best to welcome children back when we are able to reopen.

Mrs Gray re organised her classroom- again!


The corridor cupboards had a huge sort out
