

| holy | exalted or worthy of complete devotion as one perfect in goodness and righteousness (freedom from guilt or sin) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians believe that God is all-powerful and all-knowing Christians try to act in ways that they believe will please God - they use the bible to learn what these might be | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians believe that God loves them in a similar way to a parent loving a child Churches and cathedrals have features that reflect Christian beliefs about God - such as stained glass windows that tell stories, the altar where the communion is prepared and (in Catholicism) the confessional where people admit and say sorry for sins. |
| altar | the table in a Christian church at which the bread and wine are consecrated in communion services | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Ten Commandments are a list of rules that Christians believe was given by God to Moses | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Psalms of David are songs and poems written in praise of God by the Jewish king, David in the Old Testament. David was the king, who, as a young shepherd boy, defeated the giant Goliath with a slingshot. |
| sacred | devoted or dedicated to a deity (god) or to some religious purpose | | |
| psalm | A sacred song or poem often used in worship | | |
| cathedral | A large and important church which contains a bishop's chair | | |
