#### <u>Braeside</u>

Some of our Year 2 children will embark on their first residential on the 4-6<sup>th</sup> June at Braeside. We hope they enjoy their time and are sure that they will gain so much confidence and independence whilst they are there.

#### <u>Class move up days and new starters</u>

We will be spending a day during this term in our new classes, meaning that Year 2s will be off to spend the day with their new teacher Miss De Carles in Year 3. Reception and Year One will spend the day getting stuck into their new year group and will be joined for part of the day by our new Reception cohort for 2022. The new Reception children will be spending a couple of afternoons in school this term to get them ready and settled for September. I know that our current Wrens will give them a warm welcome.

#### <u>Reading</u>

Please continue to hear you child read as much as possible at home. We continue to encourage parents to fill in your child's reading log each time they are heard read.

Reception and some Year 1 children will continue to bring home banded Phonics books matched to their current phonics knowledge. Children should be able to read the books sent home with relative ease as they should include the sounds that they are secure in as opposed to any they are not sure on. This will help them to practice their blending and reading fluency. In addition to these Phonics books we will send home an additional 'sharing' book for you to read with your child for pleasure.

Some children in Year One and children in Year 2 will have completed a Star Reader test each half term which will provide us with the range of books which best fits their reading level. This reading level or ZPD will be written in their reading records and updated termly. Those who are still practicing their Phase 2-5 Phonics sounds will also bring home a Phonics book matched to their level.

### <u>English</u>

This term children in Reception will be building up their writing stamina and independence to prepare them for Year One. We will continue to discuss books that we read and the characters and plot and children but will begin to encourage them to write a little more and supply even more of their very own ideas to enhance their writing. We will continue to also explore these books and characters through role play. This term we will be basing our writing on the books 'Where the Wild Things are', 'Rosie's Walk' and 'I Wanna Iguana'.

Year One and Two will continue in their sentence stacking lessons, starting with a nonfiction report about pirates. We will also be getting them to show off their fantastic writing skills in creating their own stories and reports this term.

## <u>Maths</u>

This term Reception will focus on counting beyond 20 and understanding the repeated number patterns. They will learn about odd and even numbers and sharing into equal groups. They will continue to work to secure their numbers bonds to 5 and 10. The Term 6 KIRFs document will give ideas of ways in which you can help your child at home. The White Rose website also has a great Home Learning section should you wish to support your child further at home.

**Year One** will be looking at counting, ordering and comparing numbers to 100 before moving onto learning about money and telling the time. The Term 6 KIRFs document will give you ideas of the sticky knowledge your child should learn this term. Please continue to log on to Mathletics to support your child's Maths learning.

**Year Two** will be re-visiting shape and time this term in order to fully consolidate their learning. We will also be practicing problem solving type question which we can often find quite tricky at first. The Year Twos have really made a wonderful start with their timetables but please continue to log in to Times Table Rockstars to help consolidate your child's multiplication and division facts outside of the classroom. I will be setting work on Mathletics to support with consolidation of the new topics and those we have covered throughout the year.

### <u>Science</u>

This term's Science topic is 'Mini Worlds' and children will be learning about food chains, sorting and classifying animals and about animal habitats. As part of the topic they will spend time making a bug hotel. Please see the Mini Worlds Science Knowledge Organiser to support your child with key knowledge and vocabulary.

### Geography

This term our topic is 'Our Local Area.' Children will be taking part in fieldwork activities to help them understand the key human and physical geography of North Cerney. We will learn to draw a simple map of the area as well as identifying the key compass points and will be able to give directions using these. Please see the 'Our Local Area' Knowledge Organiser to support your child with key knowledge and vocabulary.

## Forest School

**Reception and Year One** will continue to take part in Forest School with Miss Law on a Wednesday afternoon in the school grounds. This gives children an opportunity to explore the world around them and begin to understand some of the natural processes that take place everyday. Please ensure that children are provided with a suitable change of clothes on a Wednesday, including outdoor footwear and water proofs.

# <u>PE</u>

This term PE will take place again on **Friday** and children will be developing their athletics skills in the morning followed by swimming in the afternoon. Please send your child to school in their PE kit on this day.

## Art and Design

Mrs Russell will continue to lead Art and D and T on a Friday. This term children will be completing the Victorian bathing huts that they designed and planned for last term before moving onto some landscape drawing and painting.

# <u>RE</u>

This term's key question is: How should we care for the world and for others, and why does it matter? Children will study both Christianity and Judaism and look at the ways the holy texts teach us to care for each other. We will also be linking this to the creation story to show how it teaches us to care for our world.

### <u>Homework</u>

Spelling homework will continue to be set on a Tuesday for both Year One and Year Two and will be tested the following Tuesday. Thank you to parents who are supporting the children so well at home as the weekly test results are very promising.

Maths homework will be set on Mathletics and children will receive certificates in assembly based on the amount of time they have spent practicing. **Year Two** will also be set Times Table practice on TT Rockstars.
