Aims

The Governing Body of North Cerney C of E Primary Academy has a strong focus on its three core strategic functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff.
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Governance arrangements

The Governing Body of North Cerney C of E Primary Academy consists of the following members: The Head Teacher, 1 staff governor, 2 parent governors, 2 Foundation governor and 4 co-opted governors.

The full Governing Body meets once each term and we also have 2 committees that meet to consider different aspects of the school in detail. We have a Finance, Marketing & Premises Committee and a Standards, Performance and Ethos committee who meet each term. We also have committees that meet if required to consider pupil discipline and staffing matters.

Several governors have areas of special responsibilities and visit classes to improve their knowledge and understanding of their areas. These areas of special responsibility include: SEND, e-safety, health and safety, safeguarding and child protection. It also allows them to see the impact of the strategic decisions that are made by the Head teacher and the Governing body.

Governors are welcomed in to school throughout each term to monitor a curriculum area. Monitoring information is shared at governing body meetings.

Attendance record of governors

The Governors have an excellent attendance record at meetings and we have never had to cancel a meeting because it was not quorate.

The work that we have done on our committees and in the governing body

- Attainment and progress of pupils. Governors monitor the attainment and progress of all pupils and groups of pupils each term. This includes information from the Head Teacher Report to governors.
- The Finance Committee has considered the budget closely and authorised the purchase of several resources including: redevelopment of the EYFS outdoor area. Improved the school security system, and changed catering suppliers.
- O Policy review. The governing body have ratified several statutory policies this year.
- O RAP Governors monitor the progress of the Rapid Attainment Plan. We also have a Rap Governor who attends meetings and writes a rap summary for the GB.

Minutes of the Governing Body and Committee meetings are public documents. They can be viewed by making a request at the school office.

Attendance

Governors are required to monitor the attendance of pupils and ensure that accurate records are kept. High attendance has been shown to be critical to children's progress at school and we really value your support in ensuring that no sessions are missed, except in the case of illness or exceptional family circumstances. The school's policy on attendance, which can be found on the school website, is an important document which we recommend all parents and carers should read. Our attendance has approved and continues to remain above the national average.

The purchase of the new resources has enhanced the provision for all pupils. The school currently uses programmes such as Purple Mash, TT Rockstars and Accelerated Reader.

Future plans for the Governing Body	 The new toilet block and EYFS area improve the school environment. The policies are compliant with current legislation and were adopted in the relevant fashion. School Improvement Plan: By monitoring the progress of the school improvement plan, governors are able to ensure that the strategic development of the school is robust and cohesive. Governors are aware of what is happening in school and understand the impact of each area of development. Governors have an excellent knowledge of daily school life which enables them to inform the whole governing body. They have a positive relationship with staff, pupils and parents. Continue to develop the monitoring role of the governing body. The Governors are allocated a Cohort and will move with them through the year groups.
